## **Program Objective**

To assist community organizations to improve the social well-being and resiliency of the community, with a particular focus on promoting equity, diversity, and inclusion.

## **Community Priorities**

Applications which respond to community priorities identified through community strategies and reports are encouraged. Examples Include:

- Central Okanagan Poverty and Wellness Strategy
- Kelowna Community Safety Plan
- City of Kelowna 2040 Official Community Plan (Chapter 9: Equitable Community)

# Community Social Development Grant Categories

#### **Operational Grants**

Assist with core operating activities and expenses

• Maximum of 25% of the organization's budget; up to \$25,000.

#### Project Grants

To cover costs of hosting and promoting special events (facility rental, guest speakers, food, advertising, promotional items, etc.); administrative and delivery costs for short term programs/projects (supplies and materials, facility rental, etc.); minor capital costs (e.g. office equipment) and nonpermanent staffing

• Maximum of 50% of the costs of the project; up to \$25,000.

# **Organization Profile**

- Kelowna based, established non-profit social service organization which have a mission to generate, promote or accelerate socially beneficial services or programs in the City of Kelowna
- Incorporated and actively providing the majority of their public programs and services in Kelowna for at least two years prior to the application deadline
- Demonstrate an inclusive, diverse and welcoming approach in their operations and activities

# **Organization Eligibility**

- Be a registered charity or non-profit society for at least 2 years at the time of submission
- Be physically located, have an active presence and have the majority of its programs and services delivered within the City of Kelowna for at least the last two years
- Have a social service mandate and profile which is consistent with the guidelines
- Have fulfilled all reporting requirements for any previous City of Kelowna grants or funding support
- Have a Board of Directors of volunteers and representatives of its mission and purpose

## **Intermediary Agency Agreements**

- If *not* a registered charity, then secure an intermediary
- The applying organization and the intermediary organization must be like-minded
- A written agreement must be in place and included with the grant application
- Contact Central Okanagan Foundation for a copy of the agreement template

## **Geographical Requirements**

#### Geographic limits:

Programs crossing city boundaries are eligible to apply for funding; however, grant funds can **ONLY** be used for the portion delivered within the City of Kelowna, for the benefit of City of Kelowna residents.

#### **Assessment Criteria:**

The criteria listed below and in Schedule 1 (of the guidelines) represent 'good' practices for program development and delivery.

- 1. Respond to one or more of the social development priorities, as outlined below.
- Demonstrate an evidence-based approach to improving social well-being (see page 7).
- 3. Respond to dynamic community needs that are based on local research and/or community strategies (See page 3).
- 4. Demonstrate collaboration with other service providers and/or partners in the community.
- 5. Provide clearly defined timelines and measurable performance targets to evaluate impact.
- 6. Demonstrate how the project/program will lead to sustained improvements which prevent or mitigate the impact of social inequities on vulnerable populations.
- 7. Demonstrate need for funding and a clear plan for future funding from other sources

Social Development Grants are investments that contribute to a healthy city for all. They support nonprofit community-based organizations, projects or programs that facilitate the social, physical, mental and emotional well-being of people.

*Social & Community Connections*: Increase opportunities for connection and support for people who are isolated or who are experiencing social, physical and/or economic disadvantage.

*Housing & Homelessness*: Increase organizational and/or community capacity to prevent homelessness and increase access to basic needs supports (e.g., housing, food, health and wellness) for those experiencing housing instability.

*Truth & Reconciliation*: Implement actions to advance truth and reconciliation and to address the ongoing effects of colonialism and the legacy of residential schools.

*Equity, Diversity & Inclusion*: Promote equity, diversity and inclusion by responding to the needs of underrepresented communities, including Indigenous, visible minority, immigrant and refugee communities; members of the LGBTQ2S+ community; people with DiverseAbilities; and women.

#### New this year:

*Treatment & Recovery:* Increase organizational and/or community capacity to deliver substance use disorder treatment and recovery programming.

#### Approaches to improve social well-being

- 1. Increase equity of access to opportunities by addressing barriers at the individual, organizational, and/or systems level(s).
- 2. Develop new partnerships to mobilize existing community assets, encourage shared learning and/or enable collective action.
- 3. Facilitate the meaningful engagement of people from underrepresented communities in decision making and leadership. This may include engaging people with lived or living experience in the design, development and/or delivery of projects or programs, or in organizational governance.
- 4. Support healthy youth development by co-creating opportunities for young people to develop skills, make connections, and contribute to their communities

## **Organizational Development Grant**

- Provide assistance to non-profits, registered charities, or organizations to undertake activities or initiatives which develop the organization's capacity and sustainability
- Up to 50% of the total project cost, maximum of \$5,000 (Matching support required from other sources)
- The total amount available is \$30,000
- On-going deadlines. Guidelines from City of Kelowna website. Applications from City of Kelowna staff
- Examples: board governance, strategic planning, leadership training, fund development, certification or accreditation

## **Central Okanagan Foundation**

- Grant up to \$15,000
- Multi-year operating (up to 3 years) May intake only <u>or</u> One year project (not one year operating) October intake
- Within boundaries of School District #23
- Multi-year operating grants open to registered charities only, project grants charities and non-profits with an intermediary
- May 1 & October 1, 2025
